She was a Skowhegan resident in 2019 and a 2022 finalist for the Sobey Art Award, issued by the National Gallery of Canada.

Dawit L. Petros (b. 1972, Eritrea) lives and works in Montreal and Chicago. He holds an MFA in Visual Art from the School of the Museum of Fine Arts of Tufts University (Boston), a BFA in Photography from Concordia University (Montreal), and a BA in History from the University of Saskatchewan (Saskatoon). Petros' work has been exhibited in institutions such as the Royal Ontario Museum (Toronto), Huis Marseille Museum (Amsterdam), the Museum of Contemporary Photography (Chicago), the National Museum of African Art (Washington), the Museum of Fine Arts (Boston), Bradley Ertaskiran (Montreal), The Power Plant (Toronto) and Tiwani Contemporary (London). His works are also collected by various corporate and institutional collections, namely Yale University (New Haven), the Studio Museum (Harlem), the Museum of Fine Art (Houston), Global Affairs Canada (Ottawa), Mana Contemporary (Jersey City), the Chrysler Museum of Art (Norfolk), the Museum of Contemporary Art (Montreal), and the Collection de la Caisse de Dépôt et de Placement du Québec (Quebec City). He is the recipient of the Terra Foundation for American Art Research Fellowship (2021-23), the Paul de Hueck and Norman Walford Career Achievement Award in Photography (2021), and the Duke and Duchess of York Prize in Photography (2021), as well as being named a finalist in the Norval Sovereign African Art Prize (2022).




JESSICA EATON

Jessica Eaton (b. 1977, Regina, Saskatchewan) currently lives and works in Montreal. She received her bachelor's degree in Fine Arts from the Emily Carr University of Art + Design in Vancouver. Solo exhibitions have been presented at the Museum of Contemporary Art in Cleveland, the California Museum of Photography (Riverside), and The Photographers' Gallery (London). Eaton has been featured in numerous group exhibitions, including at the Foam Fotografiemuseum (Amsterdam), the Cleveland Museum of Art's Transformer Station, the Museum of Fine Arts in St. Petersburg, the Musée d'art contemporain de Montréal, the Daegu Photography Biennale (South Korea), and Presentation House Gallery (Vancouver). Eaton's work can be found in the public collections of the National Gallery of Canada and the Musée d'art contemporain de Montréal (Canada), among others. In 2016, she was nominated for the prestigious Sobey Art Award, and in 2015, she was selected by the Capture Photography Festival to create a major public art commission for the city of Vancouver. Eaton has been awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship in 2019, solidifying her position as one of the most important Canadian photographers working today.











Marie-Michelle Deschamps Coquilles #10, 2024 Patinated bronze, copper 35.56 x 26.67 cm (14 x 10½ ")











Veronika Pausova Playing the Organs, 2021 Oil on canvas 190.5 x 170.18 cm (75 x 67 ")

Joseph Tisiga (b. 1984, Edmonton, Alberta) is a multidisciplinary artist based in Montreal and a member of the Kaska Dena First Nation. Tisiga recently held solo exhibitions at the Musée d'art de Joliette (Joliette), the Eli and Edythe Broad Art Museum, Michigan State University (East Lansing), the Audain Art Museum (Whistler), and Bradley Ertaskiran (Montreal). Other notable exhibitions include those held at the National Gallery of Canada (Ottawa), the Winnipeg Art Gallery (Winnipeg), MASS MoCA (North Adams), the Museum of Contemporary Native Arts, (Santa Fe), and at the West Vancouver Museum (Vancouver). Tisiga's work is found in institutional collections as well as in numerous private and corporate collections. Tisiga is the recipient of The Yukon Art Prize (2021), the Sobey Art Award (2020), and the REVEAL Indigenous Art Award (2017).




JULIA DAULT

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





Julia Dault Hello hello, 2024 Acrylic and oil on canvas 182.88 x 152.40 cm (72 x 60 ")











Preston Pavlis






SUZY LAKE

Suzy Lake (b. 1947, Detroit, USA) is an American-Canadian artist based in Toronto, Canada. Lake's work explores the politics of body and identity through performance, video and photography. Her later work addresses the ageing body, questioning structures of power politically and poetically. Lake's work has been presented extensively across Canada and internationally at the Centre Pompidou-Metz (Metz), Museum of Modern Art (New York), Metropolitan Museum of Art (New York), National Gallery of Canada (Ottawa), Brandhorst Museum (Munich), Montreal Museum of Fine Arts, Vancouver Art Gallery, Hayward Gallery (London), Santa Monica Museum of Art, Los Angeles Museum of Contemporary Art, the Musée d'art contemporain de Montréal, and the Art Gallery of Windsor. In 2014, the Art Gallery of Ontario presented a retrospective spanning Lake's career. Her works have also been featured in several historic feminist exhibitions including WACK! Art and the Feminist Revolution (curated by Connie Butler, touring 2007– 2008) and WOMAN: The Feminist Avant-Garde of the 1970s, Works from the Sammlung Verbund, Vienna (touring 2013-18) and are part of major private and public collections worldwide. A member of the Royal Canadian Academy of Arts, Lake was the recipient of the 2016 Governor General's Award in Visual and Media Arts, and the Scotiabank Photography Award. In 2024, she was presented with the Distinguished Artist Award for Lifetime Achievement by the College Arts Association in Chicago, Illinois.

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MARGAUX WILLIAMSON


Margaux Williamson (b. 1976, Pittsburgh, USA) is a Toronto-based artist who completed her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree at Queen's University and Glasgow School of Art. Her work has been presented in recent solo exhibitions at White Cube (Hong Kong); Esker Foundation (Calgary); Thunder Bay Art Gallery, as well as in group exhibitions at Bradley Ertaskiran (Montreal), and Goldfinch (Chicago). Her work can be found in the collections of the National Gallery of Canada (Ottawa), McMichael Canadian Art Collection (Kleinburg), Montreal Museum of Fine Art, Bruce Bailey Collection, Longlati Foundation (Shanghai), Tumurun Museum (Indonesia), and the Australia China Art Foundation. JEREMY SHAW


Jeremy Shaw (b. 1977, North Vancouver, BC) is based in Berlin. He works in a variety of media to explore altered states and the cultural and scientific practices that aspire to map transcendental experience. Often combining and amplifying strategies of verité filmmaking, conceptual art, music video and scientific research, he creates a post-documentary space that complicates expectations of image as a form of testimony. Shaw has had solo exhibitions at Centre Pompidou, Paris, MoMA PS1, New York, Schinkel Pavillon, Berlin, and MOCA Toronto, and been featured in international surveys such as the 57th Venice Biennale, 16th Lyon Biennale and Manifesta 11, Zurich. In 2016 he was awarded the Sobey Art Award and in 2018 was artist-in-residence at the Hammer Museum, Los Angeles. Works by Shaw are held in public collections worldwide including the Museum of Modern Art, New York, Centre Pompidou, Paris, Tate Modern, London, and the National Gallery of Canada, Ottawa.







PETER CAMPBELL

Peter Campbell (b. 1996, Canada) is a Canadian artist who lives and works in Montréal. Campbell's tactile, luminous, and mesmerizing paintings elevate the familiar yet often overlooked patterns that comprise both natural phenomena and everyday objects. Inspired by time-honoured artisanal methods, like basket-weaving or carved wood reliefs, Campbell is equally preoccupied with evolutionary processes and the rhythms of the natural world. Whether it's the textures created by fossilization, the play of light on water and wind on meadow grass, or the architectural domes of fungi, he is fascinated by nature's motifs and building units and explores them rigorously in his works.
